

Attention Patients:

During the course of your Procedure, micro-optics such as high powered dental microscopes and/or loupes (specialized dental magnifying glasses) may be used to zoom in (5x to 30x) to the tooth. Also, at various points in the procedure, instruments heated to 200-400°C will be used.

In order to facilitate a safe and efficient procedure for both you and the staff/doctor, please refrain from the following:

- Shaking your feet/legs, or snapping fingers to the beat of the music. As enjoyable as some songs may be, the movement causes the chair to shake, which is exacerbated under magnification.
- Turning your head to see what the doctor and staff are doing. We understand the procedure is
 very interesting or intimidating to many of you, but constant head turning requires the optics to
 have to be readjusted each time.

Your comfort and safety are of the highest priority to us, so if you need to stretch, cough, sneeze, or scratch an itch, please simply raise your **left hand** to let us know you need to pause for a moment or please wait for an opportune moment when the doctor is not actively working in the tooth.

If you have a condition that may prevent you from staying still, or feel wholly unable to sit still for any reason whatsoever, please notify the staff and doctor before being seated for treatment, so any concerns may be addressed accordingly.

Failure to follow the above guidelines could result in injury or prolonging your appointment past the allotted time, affecting the appointments of your fellow patients as well as requiring adjustment to the overall office schedule. Please respect the time of the doctors, as we do our best to provide all our patients the same respect, time, and quality of care.
